**The Life Education van will be visiting our school next week, Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2017.**



The focus of this important program is different for each year level.

**Kindergarten – My Body Matters** – Personal hygiene, choosing foods for a balanced diet, benefits of physical activity and sleep, ways to keep safe at home, at school and in the community.

**Year 1 – Ready, Steady, Go** - Benefits of physical activity, safety strategies in different environments, how our body reacts to new situations, what our body needs to be healthy (nutritious diet, water and sleep)

**Year 2 – Growing Good Friends** – Explore what health message mean, identify safety signs, behaviours that maintain friendships, places and people we can go to for help.

Each class will attend a 60 minute education session in the van. The cost is \$10.00 per child. Students must return this note along with payment prior to the activity.
